School Sports Funding  
2016/2017**

**Northcote Primary School aim to engage all pupils in regular physical activity, raise the profile of PE and sport across the school, increase the confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE, offer a range of sporting activities and increase the participation in competitive sport.**

All schools are allocated School Sports Funding through the Department for Education to support schools in the development of Physical Education. This funding is most welcome at Northcote School where a high emphasis is placed on physical exercise, educational visits, after school sports, arts and performing arts activities held before, during and after school.

**Sport Premium Funding**

This funding is ring fenced and can only be spent on improving provision of PE and sport in school.

The DfE guidance states that possible uses for the funding may be:

- hiring specialist teachers / coaches to work with Primary teachers when teaching PE.
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport.
- running sporting competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games.
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport.
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs.

School operates a high number of after school sports activities both indoor and outdoor (ran by both school staff and specialist sports coaches). These activities operate year round. This year Northcote School has been allocated approximately £9690 (not yet received 2<sup>nd</sup> payment) through the school sporting grant. We use our funding towards the following:
