Autumn Term

Recognise elements of the music e.g. the rhythm that establishes the mood and character.

Composing with Colour

Demonstrate how to use colour as an inspiration and starting point when creating new pieces of music.

Spring Term

Listen and identify similarities and differences between acoustic guitar styles.

Improvise fanfare melodies using a note set combined with short, repeated rhythms.

Compose using words to create atmosphere and effect in music

Summer Term

Global Pentatonics

Children will experience a range of pieces, with opportunities for improvisation and composing using classroom percussion instruments.

The Horse in Motion

Create music inspired by one of the first ever motion pictures showing the movement of a horse, composing to a moving image, graphic score, orchestration, ostinatos, dynamics.

Pupils will learn to sing and play the song, develop technical skills on tuned percussion, and experience playing in a class band.
