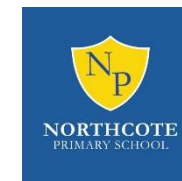

In addition to the 2 hours of P.E a week, teachers will be expected to incorporate opportunities for physical movement into other lessons. These clubs were well attended, particularly by girls. KS2 football coaching sessions were established and took place each week. School entered several competitive events for football.</p> <p>Pupil voice showed a positive shift in attitudes to playtimes and staff felt that organised activities led to more children being active at playtimes.</p>

Achievement in P.E was highlighted termly during celebration assemblies.</p>

Teachers reporting a positive impact on wider P.E achievement due to increased ability in these areas. Of our Year 6 cohort, 80% of children were able to swim by the end of the top up program.</p>
