This term we will be focusing on improving our jumping skills through fun games.

Task: Frogs on a Lilly Pad: Play this fun game with your someone in your family. Place ten numbered sheets of paper on the floor. These are your lily pads. Take turns being the 'frog' and the 'crocodile'. The frog must jump from lily pad to lily pad without being tagged by the crocodile. The crocodile can only tag you as you jump between lily pads. Try to jump to all of the lily pads in order. To change the game, try jumping to just the odd or even numbers.

Remember you are trying to improve your jumping skills.

Jumping technique:

Get Ready: Bend knees and lean forward, swing arms back.

Take Off: Spring with legs, swing up and forwards with arms.jump as high as you can

Fly: Look forward and keep your knees up.

Land: Absorb the landing softly by bending ankles, knees, and hips on impact. Arms should reach straight forward for balance. Space.


