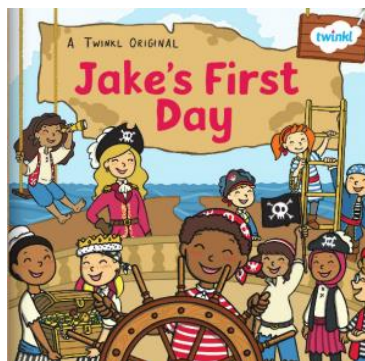

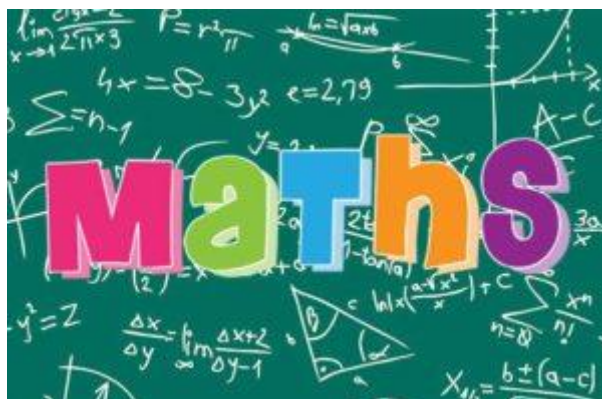


How many words can you make using the sounds:

You will need

White paper
Teabags
Small plastic bowl
of cold water
Felt tip pen
Colourful ribbon
