WHAT IS SEND?

SEND stands for Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. A child has SEND if they have a learning difficulty or disability that makes it harder for them to learn than other children of the same age.

THE FOUR BROAD AREAS OF SEND NEED



1. COMMUNICATION AND INTERACTION

Children may have difficulty with speech, language and communication or understanding and interacting with others.

Examples include:

- Speech and language difficulties
- Autism Spectrum Condition (ASC)
- Social communication needs



2. COGNITION AND LEARNING

Children may learn at a slower pace than others or have specific learning difficulties.

Examples include:

- Dyslexia
- Dyscalculia
- Moderate learning difficulties



3. SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL AND MENTAL HEALTH (SEMH)

Children may experience difficulties with their emotions, behaviour or mental health.

Examples include:

- Anxiety
- Emotional regulation
- Attachment difficulties



4. SENSORY AND/OR PHYSICAL NEEDS

Children may have a disability that affects their movement, hearing, sight or sensory processing.

Examples include:

- Hearing or visual impairment
- Physical disabilities
- Sensory processing differences
